

• Sport is an integral part of Irish life and no more so than in the capital. Gaelic football, hurling, soccer and rugby matches feature on pub TV screens and as a prominent part of daily conversation, and newspaper coverage seems boundless. Then there's also that well-known Irish fondness for a flutter, be it on the horses or the dogs.

• FESTIVALS

Dublin stages numerous festivals during the year. The arts are particularly well catered
for, with major events devoted to theatre, film, music and literature an established part
of the calendar. There's plenty for children to enjoy as well, such as the St Patrick's
festival and numerous events in Temple Bar.

• FREE DUBLIN

Though Dublin is an expensive city, there are plenty of free attractions that won't burden
your pocket. Some major sites, such as the National Gallery and National Museum,
charge no entrance fee except for special events. There's also plenty of street and
outdoor entertainment, especially in summer.

DUBLIN TASTES

Dublin's culinary reputation is fast improving, though prices can sometimes be offputting. The pleasures of modern Irish cuisine (as well as the finer points of Guinness)
are dealt with elsewhere, but there are plenty of traditional tastes that won't break the
budget and will leave you with an evocative memory of the city.
